Do you understand that once all updates are submitted, the adopter is legal allowed to sell the Adopted Horse after the one year commitment, ONLY ON THE CONDITION that SWTP is given the prospective Buyers name and complete contact information PRIOR to the sale, and the the BUYER understands that SWTP willcontine to be involved in the horse's life? The new oner must provide updates with photos at 6 and 12 months, and inform SWTP if they want to sell the horse.
